96 Percent of San Joaquin Valley Households Have Access to Broadband

BAKERSFIELD, CA February 11, 2008- Bright House Networks Bakersfield Division announced today that the findings of Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger's Broadband Task Force included in a report titled "The State of Connectivity: Building Innovation Through Broadband" that was released earlier this month show that Bakersfield and Kern County lead the way in high speed broadband service availability. In fact, the Bright House Networks service area in Kern County is one of the few areas of the San Joaquin Valley that enjoys broadband speeds in the 10Mbps to 100Mbps speed range.

According to Joe Schoenstein, President of Bright House Networks, Bakersfield Division, the news is good for Bakersfield. "We continue to invest in our network to meet our customer's needs and demands. Our fiber-rich networks have helped put Kern County on the leading edge of broadband availability with some of the fastest speeds available."

Published by the California Broadband Task Force created by Governor Schwarzenegger as part of Executive Order S-23-06 in November 2006, the report found that 96 percent of households in California have basic broadband access, placing California as a leader in broadband availability among all 50 states.

Bright House Networks offers some of the fastest high speed Internet access available anywhere in the state. Bright House Networks customers can choose from three speed packages that are designed to fit diverse data needs; Road Runner Lite at \$26.95 a month, Road Runner Standard at \$39.95 a month, and Road Runner Turbo at \$49.95 when in bundled packages.

The California Broadband Task Force has spent the last year identifying opportunities and challenges for broadband deployment and adoption. The report gives an extensive overview that includes maps of current broadband availability and speed, recommendations to achieve simultaneous access and increased use, as well as, a timeframe to achieve those goals.
